PRESIDENT'S COLUMN April, 2023

I write this column on March 18th, an unseasonably cold late winter day, with temperatures in the low 20s and a wind chill near zero. Garrison Keiller, the author and former host of the National Public Radio program A Prairie Home Companion once wrote that March weather is nature's way of telling people who don't drink what a hangover is like. I think he was on to something.

But March is also the time when we notice the spring migration, whether it is the robins returning in full force, or the juncos leaving the relatively warm confines of the Hawkeye state for their nesting grounds further north.

Birds inspire us in so many ways, not the least of which is in our songs and sayings. A few sayings come to mind: Birds of a feather flock together. Sing like a bird. In education, when teachers go on a bird walk, it means to deviate or digress from the subject at hand to discuss some topic that, while interesting, is not always germane to the lesson being taught.

And the songs! Here are a few that come to mind: 3 Little Birds by Bob Marley. Free Bird by Lynyrd Skynyrd. Bird Dog by the Everly Brothers. Feed the Birds from the movie Mary Poppins. Black Bird by the Beatles. Some of the songs about birds are meant to inspire when times are bleak. When Great Britain was under attack during the Blitz in the early years of World War II, a popular song contained the lyrics "there will be bluebirds over the white cliffs of Dover, just you wait and see." Feed the Birds reminds us to take joy in the simple things in life, and to appreciate the beauty and meaning that those acts can bring us. And the Chicken Dance is a staple at many wedding dances-a fun, joyous, and carefree way to celebrate the joining of 2 people who love each other so much that they have decided to commit themselves to each other for the rest of their lives.

There is one saying that I would love to expunge from the English language: calling someone a bird brain. Not only is it mean-spirited, but so inaccurate. After all, think about what birds can do. Many species migrate-traveling hundreds or thousands of miles, repeating the journey year after year, without so much as a map or compass. Many possess remarkable eyesight, particularly our raptors (eagle eye, eyes like a hawk come to mind).

They can build nests using the materials they have available, and some of these nests (like those of the Baltimore oriole, or the bower bird) are truly marvels of engineering. When one considers these things, the term bird brain should actually be considered a mark of intelligence, a compliment.

So-here's to the birds! May they continue to inspire us, to fill our lives with awe and wonder.


Now here's the pitch to all of our rank and file members:




